PROPERS OF THE MASS

Lesson Eph 6:10-17

Brethren: Be strengthened in the Lord and in the might of His power. Put on the armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For our wrestling is not against flesh and blood, but against the Principalities and the Powers, against the world rulers of this darkness, against the spiritual forces of wickedness on high. Therefore, take up the armor of God, that you may be able to resist in the evil day, and stand in all things perfect. Stand, therefore, having girded your loins with truth, and having put on the breast-plate of justice, and having your feet shod with the readiness of the Gospel of peace, in all things taking up the shield of faith, with which you may be able to quench all the fiery darts of the most wicked one. And take unto you the helmet of salvation and the sword of the spirit, that is, the word of God.

Gospel Matt 18:23-35

At that time, Jesus spoke to His disciples this parable: The kingdom of heaven is likened to a king who desired to settle accounts with his servants. And when he had begun the settlement, one was brought to him who owed him ten thousand talents. And as he had no means of paying, his master ordered him to be sold, with his wife and children and all that he had, and payment to be made. But the servant fell down and besought him, saying, 'Have patience with me and I will pay you all!' And moved with compassion, the master of that servant released him, and forgave him the debt. But as that servant went out, he met one of his fellow-servants who owed him a hundred denarii and he laid hold of him, and throttled him, saying, 'Pay what you owe.' His fellow-servant therefore fell down and began to entreat him, saying, 'Have patience with me and I will pay you all.' But he would not; but went away and cast him into prison until he should pay what was due. His fellow-servants therefore, seeing what had happened, were very much saddened, and they went and informed their master of what had taken place. Then his master called him, and said to him, 'Wicked servant! I forgave you all the debt, because you entreated me. Should not you also have had pity on your fellow-servant, even as I had pity on you?' And his master, being angry, handed him over to the torturers until he should pay all that was due to him. So also My heavenly Father will do to you, if you do not each forgive your brothers from your hearts.

NOV. 2-10: ALL SOULS NOVENA OF MASSES —Please enroll your loved ones in the All Souls Novena of Masses, which begins on All Souls Day (Nov. 2), and ends on Nov. 10. At least one Mass per day will be said for all of the dead enrolled in the novena. We will accept enrollments in the novena until Oct. 31. All of the names enrolled will be placed in a basket beside the High Altar, and each Mass will be offered for all of the people enrolled. Envelopes are near the entrance of the church in which you may include your intentions. You may also include a donation in honor of these loved ones. These donations will go to the parish and remain there. The parish will in turn provide the standard stipend to the priests for saying the Masses.

NOV. 6-7: REQUIEMS FOR FRATERNITY AND CONFRATERNITY—The rule of the FSSP requires the following of each Fraternity priest: "On November 5th of each year the priests of the FSSP will celebrate Requiem Masses for all the deceased members of the Fraternity and the Confraternity." As Nov. 5 falls on Sunday this year, these Masses will be celebrated by the priests on Nov. 6 and 7. Since this falls within our All Souls Novena of Masses, the public Masses each day will be for the Novena, while the private Masses will be for the deceased members of the Fraternity and the Confraternity. If you are a member of the Confraternity of St. Peter, you can be consoled knowing that these Masses are to be said for you as well once you die.

OCT. 22: NEW MEMBERS OF CONFRATERNITY—If you have joined the Confraternity of St. Peter in the last year, we invite you to take part in a special ceremony next Sunday. New members of the Confraternity are invited to the Communion Rail after each Mass next Sunday to pray the prayer of the Confraternity and receive a blessing. Notes on Today's Music

Processional hymn: O Glorious Maid, Exalted Far, 911 Recessional hymn: Daily, Daily Sing to Mary, 912

Kyriale: Mass IX, 731; Credo III, 776

Motet at the offertory: Omni die dic Mariae, Grzegorz Gerwazy

Gorczycki (c.1667–1734)

Motet at communion: Ave Maris Stella, Tomás Luis de Victoria

(c.1548–1611)

Omni die dic Mariae is sometimes referred to as "The Hymn of St. Casimir" for a copy was found inside his coffin and many have attributed the authorship to him. The full text of the prayer is lengthy with 20 verses using an intricate rhyme scheme. This portion is only the second half of a hymn of praise to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Grzegorz Gerwazy Gorczycki set this portion of the hymn to music in a way that mirrors the rhyme scheme and could be sung in its entirety if applied to each verse. Today, the choir will sing only four verses. It is also translated and paraphrased in today's recessional, Daily, Daily Sing to Mary. The melody was first found in an Ingolstadt hymnal from 1613 and has since been associated with all German versions of the text. It corresponds to the form of the poem in terms of rhythm and style.

Grzegorz Gerwazy Gorczycki (c.1667–1734) is considered one of the greatest composers of Polish Baroque music. He was ordained a priest on 22 March 1692. Following his ordination, he lectured in rhetoric and poetry, as well as conducting orchestras and was later appointed conductor of the Kraków cathedral choir and orchestra. He remained in that position until his death on 30 April 1734.
