In total, we will have six Masses on Christmas, but only four will be public.

DIVINE OFFICE: TERCE—Starting in the new year, seeking to more faithfully abide by the Constitutions of the FSSP, the priests will add Tuesday and Saturday to the days on which they sing the office of Terce 8am. It will be recited immediately after Exposition and in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. The rubrics provide a way to celebrate the Divine Office when the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, which requires the choir to remain standing rather than sitting, since sitting in the presence of the Exposed Blessed Sacrament is not proper. We invite the Faithful present to do the same.

If you would like to benefit from this blessing, bring to Mass on Monday your bottles and place them in the place designated. They will be blessed immediately following the Last Gospel. Please remove your bottles right away, or no doubt someone else will drink them. The blessing says, in part: 'Bless and consecrate, O Lord God, this chalice of wine (or any other beverage) through the merits of St. John, Apostle and Evangelist. Bestow benediction and protection upon all who drink of this cup. For as the blessed John partook of the poisoned potion without any hurt, so may all who on this day drink of the blessed wine to the honor of St. John, by him be freed from poisoning and similar harmful things. And as they offer themselves soul and body to thee, O Lord God, give them absolution and pardon.....Bless, O Lord, this draught that it be a helpful medicine to all who drink it; and grant by thy grace that all who taste thereof may enjoy bodily and spiritual health in calling upon thy holy name.""
