Passion Sunday

Lesson Eph 5:1-9

Brethren: Be imitators of God, as very dear children and walk in love, as Christ also loved us and delivered Himself up for us an offering and a sacrifice to God to ascend in fragrant odor. But immorality and every uncleanness or covetousness, let it not even be named among you, as becomes saints; or obscenity or foolish talk or scurrility, which are out of place; but rather thanksgiving. For know this and understand, that no fornicator, or unclean person, or covetous one - for that is idolatry - has any inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and God. Let no one lead you astray with empty words; for because of these things the wrath of God comes upon the children of disobedience. Do not, then, become partakers with them. For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Walk, then, as children of light, for the fruit of the light is in all goodness and justice and truth.

Gospel Luke 11:14-28

At that time, Jesus was casting out a devil, and the same was dumb; and when He had cast out the devil, the dumb man spoke. And the crowds marveled. But some of them said, By Beelzebub, the prince of devils, He casts out devils. And others, to test Him, demanded from Him a sign from heaven. But He, seeing their thoughts, said to them: Every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desola-

tion, and house will fall upon house. If, then, Satan also is divided against himself, how shall his kingdom stand? because you say that I cast out devils by Beelzebub. Now, if I cast out devils by Beelzebub, by whom do your children cast them out? Therefore they shall be your judges. But if I cast out devils by the finger of God, then the kingdom of God has come upon you. When the strong man, fully armed, guards his courtyard, his property is undisturbed. But if a stronger than he attacks and overcomes him, he will take away all his weapons that he relied upon, and will divide his spoils. He who is not with Me is against Me; and he who does not gather with Me scatters. When the unclean spirit has gone out of a man, he roams through waterless places in search of rest; and finding none, he says, 'I will return to my house which I left.' And when he has come to it, he finds the place swept. Then he goes and takes seven other spirits more evil than himself, and they enter in and dwell there; and the last state of that man becomes worse that the first. Now it came to pass as He was saying these things, that a certain woman from the crowd lifted up her voice and said to Him, Blessed is the womb that bore You, and the breasts that nursed You. But He said, Rather, blessed are they who hear the word of God and keep it.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mar. 20: Traditional St. Joseph Table—This popular devotion in honor of St. Joseph will be arranged in the reception hall of the parish center. Please visit after the 6:30pm High Mass on Mar. 20 (the feast is moved by one day because if falls on a Sunday). The tradition of the "St. Joseph Table" ("la tavala di San Giuseppe") has its origin in Sicily. Legends from the Middle Ages attributed the end of a devastating drought to a prayer devotion that the Sicilian people made to St. Joseph. This celebration is a symbolic "thank you" and renewal of the Sicilian people's devotion to Saint Joseph. To participate, please drop off your bread inside the wooden doors of 112 State St. before the 6:30pm High Mass.

New Votive Candles for St. Joseph—Also in honor of St. Joseph, we will be making candles available on Mar. 19 to be burned before his altar as votive offerings. These specific candles will normally be stubs from the candles burned on the high altar for Mass. Rather than waste these candles by recycling them with several inches remaining, and rather than burning them all the way down at the altar for Mass (that can get messy), we provide these stubs for you to offer for your own private intentions. We invite you to make a donation to cover the cost of these candles, and to burn them beside the altar of St. Joseph. For your information, for the past several months, we have been burning candles on the altars that are made of 100 percent beeswax (previously we burned 51 percent beeswax), which is a precious substance required for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, and deep in its religious symbolism. Once these beeswax stubs have burned all of the way down, we will then take the small bit that remains, collect them, then send them back to be recycled into new candles. In this way, we will try to avoid wasting any of this wonderful substance made by the bees.

Update on matching gift for new parish library: Thanks to two generous donations last Sunday, totaling \$1,650, we now only need \$8,350 to meet the matching gift goal of \$10,000. If we meet that goal, an anonymous benefactor will donate an additional \$20,000. The funds will go towards the construction of a new parish library, which is expected to cost between \$20,000 and \$25,000, and the additional will go toward buying more books. Friday Fish Fries in Lent continues—The Knights of Columbus' Fish Fry is every Friday in Lent from 6:15pm to 8pm. When placing your orders, please indicate whether or not you wish to have your meal ready after Stations of the Cross so that it will be done in time for you. \$10 buys a plate with Fried Fish, French Fries, Mac and Cheese, and Salad. To-go options are available and can be scheduled in advance.

Mar. 17: 6:30pm Mass for the Feast of St. Patrick, the principal patron of the Diocese of Harrisburg and of the Diocesan Cathedral which places this feast day in a unique and important relationship to the Church of Harrisburg. As such, Bishop Gainer has granted a dispensation from the obligation to abstain from meat on this day. It is not required that Catholics make use of this dispensation; those who voluntarily choose to avail themselves of this dispensation are encouraged to abstain from meat on some other day as part of their penitential practices during Lent.

New sign for St. Lawrence—St. Lawrence now has a new sign hanging on the front of the church. This sign replaces its predecessor which needed to be updated with the latest details of parish life, including information about the Divine Office, updated scheduling of Mass and Adoration, and details of the parish's business office hours, which are now finally published, enabling parishioners to stop by unannounced to take care of any of their parish business. The success of this project is thanks to the hard work of Melissa Roma and others; and it's amazing how much detail and work are involved in the process! We encourage parishioners to download a copy of the new sign that is available on our website, and post it on their refrigerators.

St. Lawrence's new registration database—With the launch of our new website, we are also offering parishioners the opportunity to manage their own family's parish registration record, helping us to have the most up-to-date information that you would like us to have.

This software is called ParishSOFT with a Family Suite module that we will use to keep Family records current. Please feel free to create a login for yourself, and update your information to the extent you can. The system generates notifications of changes to records which we will check with our records to confirm that the records match, then send you an email confirmation, giving you access to your account. Once you have received the confirmation, you can set a password for yourself, review your family's records, correct any errors and update it with any new information going forward.

From the home page on our website, click on the "Get Involved" header, select "Parish Registration," then click the "Register online" option which will take you to ParishSOFT registration where you must select "St. Lawrence Catholic Church, Harrisburg" in the drop-down menu options for your Organization.
