PROPERS OF THE MASS

Lesson Jas 1:22-27

Dearly beloved: But be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves. For if a man be a hearer of the word, and not a doer, he shall be compared to a man beholding his own countenance in a glass. For he beheld himself, and went his way, and presently forgot what manner of man he was. But he that hath looked into the perfect law of liberty, and hath continued therein, not becoming a forgetful hearer, but a doer of the work; this man shall be blessed in his deed. And if any man think himself to be religious, not bridling his tongue, but deceiving his own heart, this man's religion is vain. NEW SET OF VESTMENTS NEEDED FOR SOLEMN

MASS—For the Roman Rite, the Church primarily uses vestments in five different colors for Mass: white, green, red, violet, and black. For Gaudete and Laetare Sundays, a special rose color is allowed, signifying the lessening of penance on those days. In addition, very special vestments can be made out of cloth of gold or cloth of silver. White (or gold or silver), is used for the biggest feast days of Easter and Christmas, as well as feasts of Our Lady, and other virgins and confessors. Red is used for Pentecost. As such, it is very important that the parish have several sets of white vestments, including special vestments to be used for Solemn Masses on Easter and Christmas, and for events like Confirmation when the sacrament is celebrated on a day when the Mass uses white vestments. This is the case for Confirmation this year, which falls on Trinity Sunday (June 4), and we find that we do not have a good white set that can be used for such an occasion. For Christmas and Easter recently, we have been using vestments owned by the priests privately, but these sets are not large enough to accommodate a Solemn Pontifical Mass, with which we are blessed this year. Therefore, we have ordered additional vestments, which will cost \$8,000. We have already a received donation of \$2,000 for these vestments, but we would be very grateful if others would donate for the remainder. These vestments would be used for other solemn occasions in which white vestments are needed, such as Solemn Masses at Christmas and Easter. If you would like to contribute to this project, please place a gift in the offertory and mark it, "for vestments."

Notes on Today's Music

Notes on Today's Music

Processional hymn: Immaculate Mary, 906

Kyriale: Mass I; Creed III

Recessional hymn: Be Joyful Mary, Heav'nly Queen, 847

Antiphon after the Offertory Chant: *O quam metuendus est* - (Tomás Luis de Victoria, c.1548–1611)

Communion hymn: *Urbs Beata Jerusalem* - (Pietro Pontio,

1532–1596)

Both of the choral selections are settings of texts from the proper of the Dedication of a Church because today is the anniversary of the dedication of St. Patrick, our Diocesan Cathedral. The Communion Hymn is a setting of the ancient Vespers hymn which dates to the 7th C. Like Victoria's hymn last week, **Pietro Pontio** composed the even verses while alternating with the Gregorian melody. In verse two, the voices stagger entrances as the texts describes heaven coming to the earth. The verse ends with, "...her walls are decked with purest gold." and the final chord is a perfect fifth, which is a customary ending for music of this period that has a pure, strong and ringing quality. In verse four, it describes the building blocks of the church as bruised and pressed into polished stones while the voices are tightly pressed together and the harmony changes drastically in a short period of time. As the music comes to an end, the tone shifts from minor to major which emphasizes the final words of the hymn, "... per manus Artificis, Disponuntur permansuri, sacris aedificiis" (the stones) are arranged by the hands of the Architect to forever be a holy building).

Pietro Pontio (1532–1596) was an Italian music theorist and composer from Parma. He is best known for his 1588 treatise, *Ragionamento di Musica*, which is thought to have influenced Claudio Monteverdi (1567-1643), the famous Italian composer and choirmaster who was a pioneer in the development of opera.
