PROPERS OF THE MASS

Lesson 2 Cor. 3:4-9

Brethren: Such is the assurance I have through Christ toward God. Not that we are sufficient of ourselves to think anything, as from ourselves, but our sufficiency is from God. He also it is Who has made us fit ministers of the new covenant, not of the letter but of the spirit; for the letter kills, but the spirit gives life. Now if the ministration of death, which was engraved in letters upon stones, was inaugurated in such glory that the children of Israel could not look steadfastly upon the face of Moses on account of the transient glory that shone upon it, shall not the ministration of the spirit be still more glorious? For if there is glory in the ministration that condemned, much more does the ministration that justifies abound in glory.

At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: Blessed are the eyes that see what you see! For I say to you, many prophets and kings have desired to see what you see, and they have not seen it; and to hear what you hear, and they have not heard it. And behold, a certain lawyer got up to test Him, saying, Master, what must I do to gain eternal life? But He said to him, What is written in the Law? How do you read? He answered and said, You shall love the Lord your God with your whole heart, and with your whole soul, and with your whole strength, and with your whole mind; and your neighbor as yourself. And He said to him, You have answered rightly; do this and you shall live. But he, wishing to justify himself, said to Jesus, And who is my neighbor? Jesus answered and said, A certain man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and he fell in with robbers, who after both stripping him and beating him went



Notes on Today's Music

Processional hymn: Praise, My Soul, the King of Heaven, 933

Recessional hymn: *Hail, Holy Queen*, 908 Kyriale: Mass XI, 740; Credo III, 776

Antiphon after Offertory: Ubi Caritas, Chant harmonized by

Craig Kingsbury (b. 1952)

Motet after Communion: O Salutaris Hostia, Pierre de la Rue

(c.1452–1518)

The chant *Ubi Caritas* is the 8th and final antiphon that is sung during the washing of feet on Holy Thursday. The text of the refrain is: *Where charity and love are, there is God.* Today the choir will sing the original Gregorian melody with a choral refrain.

O Salutaris Hostia's text is from the last two lines of the hymn Verbum Supernam written by St. Thomas Aquinas for Lauds on the feast of Corpus Christi. It is most commonly sung at the beginning of solemn Eucharistic adoration. Pierre de la Rue composed this setting as a part of his Missa de Sancta Anna and is one of only a few cases where this text would have been sung in place of Benedictus immediately following the consecration.

Pierre de la Rue (c.1452–1518) was a Franco-Flemish composer and singer of the Renaissance from the Netherlands. In 1492, joined the *Grande chapelle*, the musical establishment of the Burgundian-Habsburg court of Holy Roman Emperor Maxmilian. He remained in the employ of the Habsburgs and the *Grande chapelle* for the rest of his life creating a diverse range of compositions including Masses, sacred motets, Magnificats, settings of the Lamentations, and secular *chansons*.
