PROPERS OF THE MASS

Lesson Gal 5:25-26; 6:1-10

Brethren: If we live by the Spirit, by the Spirit let us also walk. Let us not become desirous of vainglory, provoking one another, envying one another. Brethren, even if a person is caught doing something wrong, you who are spiritual instruct such a one in a spirit of meekness, considering yourself, lest you also be tempted. Bear one another's burdens, and so you will fulfill the law of Christ. For if anyone thinks himself to be something, whereas he is nothing, he deceives himself. But let everyone test his own work, and so he will have glory in himself only, and not in comparison with another. For each one will bear his own burden. And let him who is instructed in the word share all good things with his teacher. Be not deceived, God is not mocked. For what a man sows in the flesh, from the flesh also will reap corruption. But he who sows in the spirit, from the spirit will reap life everlasting. And in doing good let us not grow tired; for in due time we shall reap if we do not relax. Therefore, while we have time, let us do good to all men, but especially to those who are of the household of faith.

At that time, Jesus went to a town called Naim; and His disciples and a large crowd went with Him. And as He drew near the gate of the town, behold, a dead man was being carried out, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow; and a large gathering from the town was with her. AED REVIEW—The Church now has two working AEDs. One is near the parish Secretary's office in the Parish Center (112 State Street) and the other is on the wall of the stairs going up to the choir loft. In addition, each bathroom throughout both buildings have been stocked with first aid kits. The two AEDs have recently been inspected and updated to confirm that they are safe to use. When needed, they should be used by parishioners who are trained. The focus of this review will be to review the locations of the AEDs, first aid kits, and their proper use. Confirmation Date Announcement - We are happy to announce that the diocese has given us a tentative date for next year's Confirmations. Bishop Ronald Gainer is scheduled to do next year's Confirmations on Sunday, April 14th, the Second Sunday after Easter. If your child is old enough to receive the sacrament of Confirmation, please register for our Sunday CCD program which begins in October.

REGISTER NOW FOR CCD—CCD (Sunday catechism for K-12) will begin on Oct. 1, so please register soon so we can organize the classrooms and finalize other details. By God's grace, we again have a large group of volunteers to teach in our Sunday catechism program. I am especially grateful to Phillip Cuccia, who is now our parish's volunteer director of religious education (DRE), and was a big help to me last year in organizing CCD.

The duty of instructing the children of the parish in their catechism is very important, as so many popes and saints have told us. You may not know, however, that in Our Lady's only proven apparition in the United States she emphasized the importance of teaching catechism. Our Lady of Champion (a title approved just this year by the Holy See, and named for the town in Wisconsin where she appeared) told the visionary, Adele Brise:

"Gather the children in this wild country and teach them what they should know for salvation."

"But how shall I teach them who know so little myself?" Adele said.

"Teach them," replied her radiant visitor, "their catechism, how to sign themselves with the sign of the Cross, and how to approach the sacraments; that is what I wish you to do. Go and fear nothing, I will help you."
