## ANNOUNCEMENTS

MAR. 2: BP. SENIOR TO VISIT ST. LAWRENCE—We are happy to announce that Bp. Senior has accepted our invitation to visit St. Lawrence for the singing of Bach's *St. John Passion* on Saturday night, March 2. Bach's *passions* are great musical achievements and present the texts of the various accounts of Christ's Passion set to music. Not part of the liturgy, but for private devotion, the music will be sung in German, which is quite appropriate given the German heritage of St. Lawrence Church. We are grateful that Bp. Senior has accepted this invitation and will join us for this event.

JAN. 20: FSSP BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT—Teams from various FSSP apostolates in the region plan to travel to St. Lawrence Saturday, Jan. 20, for a regional FSSP basketball tournament at the East Shore YMCA beginning at 1pm. JAN. 28: PALMS FOR ASH WEDNESDAY— Traditionally, the ashes for Ash Wednesday are burned from the palms used during the prior year's Palm Sunday. Starting on Septuagesima Sunday, January 28, we will begin collecting last year's palms to be burned for Ash Wednesday. Please place your palms in the basket near the entrance of the church.

**FEB. 2: HIGH MASS FOR CANDLEMAS**—All are encouraged to bring their own beeswax candles to be blessed at the High Mass at 6:30pm on Feb. 2, the Feast of the Purification of Blessed Virgin Mary. Please place your candles on the floor in front of the door that goes to the courtyard on the Epistle side of the Church.

**FEB. 3 BLESSING OF THROATS ON THE FEAST OF ST. BLAISE**— On the Feast of St. Blaise, come to the church to receive the traditional blessing of throats through the intercession of St. Blaise, to be healed of any mid-winter throat ailments. The priests will give the blessing after the 9am Mass.

FEB. 3: BLESSING OF BREAD, FRUIT, WINE, AND WATER—In addition to receiving the blessing yourself on that day, you may bring bread, fruits, wine, and water to be blessed so that, as the blessing says, "May they who taste thereof be fully healed of all affliction of the throat, as well as every infirmity of soul or body, through the prayers and merits of the same Blaise, Pontiff and Martyr." The blessing on the Feast of St. Blaise, though, asks the people to bring items to be blessed. It says: "We humbly beseech thy boundless mercy, and beg that these fruits, bread, wine, and water, which thy devoted people bring today, be blessed and sanctified by thy goodness." You are most welcome (encouraged!) to bring things on that day for the blessing. Bring them before Mass and set them in front of Our Lady's altar to be blessed immediately after Mass. Note: please do not bring items for this blessing before Feb.3.

#### Notes on Today's Music

Processional hymn: *Praise to the Lord*, 927 Recessional hymn: *Come Down, O Love Divine*, 887 Credo IV, 780, Kyriale IV, 710

Offertory motet: *Alma Redemptoris Mater*, GP Palestrina (c. 1547–1580) Communion motet: *O Admirabile Commercium*, Fabio Constantini (c. 1575–1644)

O Admirabile Commercium, is a motet by Fabio Constantini and setting of the first Antiphon from Vespers on the Octave of Christmas. The translation is: O admirable exchange: the creator of human-kind, taking on a living body was worthy to be born of a virgin, and, coming forth as a human without seed, has given us his deity in abundance.

Fabio Constantini (c. 1575–1644) was an Italian music editor and composer. He sang under Palestrina at St Peter's, Rome (until 1610), and held posts as *maestro di cappella*, notably at Orvieto Cathedral (1610-14, 1618-22), Santa Casa, Loreto, Ancona and Ferrara Cathedral.

**MARRIAGE PREP CLASSES**—Starting Feb. 9, 2024, and going until March 15, 2024, there will be a Marriage Preparation Class every Friday night at 7:30pm. This class is mandatory for any spring or summer marriages at St. Lawrence this year. Prior to admission in the class, each of the engaged couple must schedule a meeting with the pastor and request that a recently issued baptismal certificate be sent via post directly to the parish.

**DIVINE OFFICE: TERCE**—Starting in the beginning of this year, the priests now recite the Office of Terce together at 8am on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Fridays, and Saturdays. On Tuesdays and Saturdays, Terce is recited immediately after Exposition and in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. When the Divine Office is recited in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, all remain standing.
