PASSION—Since there will be a limited number of space to hear Bach's beautiful setting of St. John's *Passion*, you should reserve your seat now. To reserve seats (for free), go here: https://bit.ly/stlawrence-BachPassion. Seats will be reserved for parishioners until Feb. 18, after which, non-parishioners will be invited to reserve seats.

MAR. 2: BP. SENIOR AND FR. JOSEF BISIG, FSSP—As previously mentioned, we are delighted the Bp. Senior will join us for St. John's *Passion*, but now we have just received confirmation from Fr. Josef Bisig, FSSP, will also come. Fr. Bisig is the main founder of the FSSP and the rector of our seminary in Nebraska, and he is making a special trip to Harrisburg just to hear this beautiful music. Bach's *Passions* are great musical achievements and present the texts of the different gospel accounts of Christ's Passion set to music. Not part of the liturgy, but for private devotion, the music will be sung in German, which is quite appropriate given the German heritage of St. Lawrence Church.

QUINQUAGESIMA SUNDAY—The Church gives us to-day another subject for our meditation: it is the vocation of Abraham. When the waters of the deluge had subsided, and mankind had once more peopled the earth, the immorality, which had previously excited God's anger, again grew rife among men. Idolatry, too, into which the antediluvian race had not fallen, now showed itself, and human wickedness seemed thus to have reached the height of its malice. Foreseeing that the nations of the earth would fall into rebellion against Him, God resolved to select one people that should be peculiarly His, and among whom should be preserved those sacred truths, of which the Gentiles were to lose sight. This new people was to originate from one man, who would be the father and model of all future believers. This was Abraham. His faith and devotedness merited for him that he should be chosen to be the father of the children of God, and the head of that spiritual family, to which belong all the elect of both the old and the new Testament.

It is necessary, therefore, that we should know Abraham, our father and our model. This is his grand characteristic: fidelity to God, submissiveness to His commands, abandonment and sacrifice of everything in order to obey His holy will. Such ought to be the prominent virtues of every Christian. Let us, then, study the life of our great patriarch, and learn the lessons it teaches.

The following passage from the Book of Genesis, which the Church gives us in her Matins of to-day, will serve as the text of our considerations.

From the Book of Genesis. Ch. xii. And the Lord said to Abram: Go forth out of thy country, and from thy kindred and out of thy father's house, and come into the land which I shall show thee. And I will make of thee a great nation, and I will bless thee, and magnify thy name, and thou shalt be blessed. I will bless them that bless thee, and curse them that curse thee; and in thee shall all the kindred of the earth be blessed. So Abram went out as the Lord had commanded him, and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he went forth from Haran. And he took Sarai his wife, and Lot, his brother's son, and all the substance which they had gathered, and the souls which they had gotten in Haran: and they went out to go into the land of Chanaan. And when they were come into it, Abram passed through the country into the place of Sichem, as far as the noble vale: now the Chanaanite was at that time in the land. And the Lord appeared to Abram, and said to him: To thy seed will I give this land. And he built there an altar to the Lord, who had appeared to him. And passing on from thence to a mountain, that was on the east side of Bethel, he there pitched his tent, having Bethel on the west, and Haï on the east. He built there, also, an altar to the Lord, and culled upon his name.

Guidelines for fasting during Lent—Laws according to The Discipline of 1962

Laws of Days of Abstinence—1962: Applies at age 7

Complete abstinence: all Fri1days of the year, Ash Wednesday, Holy Saturday, and the Vigil of Christmas

Current Practice: Applies at age 14—Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent, and obliges abstention from flesh meat

Laws of Days of Abstinence—1962: Partial abstinence: all the days of Lent, the Ember days of Wednesday and Saturday, and the Vigils of Pentecost and the Assumption (meat and soup, or gravy made from meat permitted once per day at the principal meal)

Current Practice: Not applicable

Laws of Days of Abstinence—1962: Abstinence from meat is dispensed on Holy Days of Obligation

Current Practice: Dispensed on Solemnities

Laws of Fast—1962: Applies for ages 21 to 59, inclusive Days of Lent from Ash Wednesday inclusive of Ember Days, and Vigils of Christmas, Pentecost, and the Assumption

Current Practice: Age 18 to 59—Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, but also on specified days of penance

Laws of Fast—1962: One full meal permitted, and two other meals may be taken which, when combined, are less than a full meal

Current Practice: Same

Notes on Today's Music

Processional hymn: *Soul of My Savior*, 938 Recessional hymn: *Jesus, My Lord, My God, My All*, 899 Kyriale: Mass XI, 740; Credo IV, 780

Offertory Antiphon: *Benedictus es Domine*, Orlandus Lassus Chant after Offertory: *Ubi Caritas*, Chant Motet at Communion: *Anima Christi*, Msgr. Marco Frisina (b. 1954)

The Offertory antiphon this Sunday is a choral setting by **Orlandus Lassus** with text from Psalm 118:12-13: *Blessed are You, O Lord; teach me Your statutes. With my lips I declare all the ordinances of Your mouth.*

Ubi Caritas is the 8th and final antiphon that is sung during the washing of feet on Holy Thursday. The text of the refrain is: *Where charity and love are, there is God*. The choir will sing the original Gregorian melody with a choral refrain harmonized by Craig Kingsbury.

The motet after the Communion chant might be the most famous setting of the prayer *Anima Christi* by Msgr. Marco Frisina. Monsignor's setting can be accompanied with either strings or organ and alternates full choir with a solo voice.

Orlandus Lassus (c.1532–1594) is known for the mature polyphonic style in the Franco-Flemish school. He wrote over 2,000 works in Latin, French, Italian, and German both sacred and secular. Lassus along with Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina and Tomás Luis de Victoria are the most influential composers of the late Renaissance.
