 Part of G.P. Palestrina's prolific compositional output includes the publication, <i>Offertoria totius anni</i>, which contains 68 five-voice choral settings of Offertory Antiphons for Sundays and major feasts. This Sunday's Offertory is taken from this compilation. Palestrina uses melodies and harmonies centered in a major key, giving the motet a bright color and conveying the joyful nature of the Psalm. <i>The statutes of the Lord are right, and rejoice the heart his judgments sweeter also than honey, and the honey-comb. For thy servant keeps them.</i> –Psalm 18:9,11-12 	BUILDING FUND STATUS: As was discussed in the FY23 financial report, the amount brought in to the building fund was not enough to cover the church mortgage. Church mortgage payments in FY23 were \$155,000 and the building fund brought in \$111,000, meaning that the \$44,000 deficit was covered by the parish's operational budget. The mortgage of \$155,000 per year comes to about \$13,000 per month, and so far this year we have received on average
