EASTER GRATITUDE—Father Smith and all the priests would like to thank the servers, scholas, choir, ushers, flower guild, and all who helped to setup, clean, prepare and execute all of our beautiful liturgies during Holy Week, including our paid and volunteer staff. Many, many hours were spent practicing and singing, cleaning linens, preparing flowers, and much more to offer right worship to our God in these sacred days. We are also thankful for all who gave time and effort in bringing about the various aspects of our parish Easter party. It is important to celebrate feast days well, and every contribution towards that effort is appreciated.

**DIVINE MERCY INDULGENCE**—A plenary indulgence is granted under the usual conditions to faithful who, on the Second Sunday of Easter, in any church or chapel, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy, or who, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, recite the Our Father and the Creed, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus. (Decree of the Apostolic Penitentiary: June 13, 2002)

**EASTER HOME BLESSING APRIL 1-APRIL 6**—Similar to the Epiphany home blessings earlier this year, the priests will be blessing homes during the Octave of Easter. This blessing will be offered to the first 10 people who request it and who did not receive the Epiphany home blessing this year. PAPAL BLESSING—A plenary indulgence is granted to the faithful who devoutly receive a blessing imparted by the Supreme Pontiff of Rome and the World (*Urbi et Orbi*), even if, because of reasonable circumstances, they are unable to be present physically at the sacred rite, provided that they follow it devoutly as it is broadcast live by television or radio, under the usual conditions. (Manual of Indulgences, n.4) Pope Francis will impart this blessing on Easter Sunday, March 31st at 12pm Rome time (7am EST).

CHURCH COURTYARD AS CROSSROADS—Because we have recently closed off public access to our courtyard and the alley between the church and parish center with a large, steel gate, we can now use the courtyard as a crossroads allowing parishioners to get to several places from there. These include: stairs down to the basement social hall, the parish center, class rooms in both buildings, and the church itself using the door by the St. Joseph altar. ## **Notes on Today's Music**

Processional Hymn: Jesus Christ is Ris'n Today, 843 Recessional hymn: At the Lamb's High Feast We Sing, 848

Kyriale: *Missa Brevis in G, K140*, Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart

(1756-1791)

The Missa Brevis in G by W. A. Mozart has been given the title of the "Pastoral Mass" because of its lyrical and bright melodies throughout the work. As is common for Masses of this time, Mozart uses soloists in contrast to full choir to give variety to the composition and bring attention to the text of the prayer. For example in the Credo the full choir sings together until "descendit de cælis" at which point the music stops. Then a soprano soloist sings "Et incarnatus est" in a slower tempo with lighter accompaniment which emphasizes the solemnity of the Incarnation. The Agnus Dei is atypical for a Missa Brevi because it is uncharacteristically long. In some editions, Mozart cut about 25 measures from the "Dona nobis" portion of the movement. Today the choir will sing the movement in its entirety.

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart (1756–1791) was a prolific and influential composer of the Classical period and perhaps the most widely celebrated in the history of Western music. Despite his short life, his rapid pace of composition resulted in more than 800 works including Masses, symphonies, operas, and chamber works.

Mighty Victim from the sky, Hell's fierce pow'rs beneath Thee lie; Thou hast conquered in the fight, Thou hast brought us life and light; Now no more can death appall, Now no more the grave enthrall; Thou has opened Paradise, And in Thee Thy saints shall rise.
