Be it known to all here present that Gabriel Matthew Harder, of the quasi-parish of St. Lawrence of Rome, Deacon and Martyr, of Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, son of Matthew and Elizabeth Harder of the parish of St. Joseph the Worker, or Ozark, Missouri; and Martina Mikulic, of the quasi-parish of St. Lawrence of Rome, Deacon and Martyr, of Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, daughter of Zdenko and Zdenka Mikulic of the parish of the Prince of Peace, of Steelton, Pennsylvania, intend to be united in holy matrimony. Wherefore, we hereby admonish each and all that, if any of you has knowledge of an impediment existing which would prevent their marrying, whether it be an impediment of blood relationship, relationship through marriage, spiritual relationship, or of any other kind, you are bound to make it known to the pastor or bishop as soon as possible. **CHURCH COURTYARD AS CROSSROADS**—Because we have recently closed off public access to our courtyard and the alley between the church and parish center with a large, steel gate, we can now use the courtyard as a crossroads allowing parishioners to get to several places from there. These include: stairs down to the basement social hall, the parish center, class rooms in both buildings, and the church itself using the door by the St. Joseph altar. Public access to this area was closed off by the gate at the rear of the alley. <b>Orlandus Lassus's</b> , <i>Missa Puisque J'ai Perdu</i> , is a polyphonic setting of the ordinary parts of the Mass. In his four voice setting of <i>Regina Cæli</i> , Cristóbal de Morales uses this familiar melody with some ornamentation in the Soprano voice. The Alto voice echos much of the Soprano melody at a lower pitch while the Tenor and Bass voices have many moving notes throughout. He emphasizes the final alleluia by having each voice sing a series of ascending notes then drop to a lower pitch and repeat several times which lasts well over a quarter of the overall work.	<b>NOTE:</b> Thank you very much for closing the gap on the building fund. As you can see from the numbers from last month, we were slightly behind our goal for the building fund, which is only to pay the mortgage on the church (\$155,000 per year, or approximately \$13,000 per month). Thanks to your generosity, we met our goal for March, and we are now slightly ahead of our year-to-date goal.
<b>Orlandus Lassus (c.1532–1594)</b> is known for the mature polyphonic style in the Franco-Flemish school. He wrote over 2,000 works in Latin, French, Italian, and German both sacred and secular.
