Banns of Marriage

Be it known to all here present that Gabriel Matthew Harder, of the quasi-parish of St. Lawrence of Rome, Deacon and Martyr, of Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, son of Matthew and Elizabeth Harder of the parish of St. Joseph the Worker, or Ozark, Missouri; and Martina Mikulic, of the quasi-parish of St. Lawrence of Rome, Deacon and Martyr, of Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, daughter of Zdenko and Zdenka Mikulic of the parish of the Prince of Peace, of Steelton, Pennsylvania, intend to be united in holy matrimony. Wherefore, we hereby admonish each and all that, if any of you has knowledge of an impediment existing which would prevent their marrying, whether it be an impediment of blood relationship, relationship through marriage, spiritual relationship, or of any other kind, you are bound to make it known to the pastor or bishop as soon as possible. This is the third publication of the banns.

MAY 1: SOLEMNITY OF ST. JOSEPH—Between 1870 and 1955, this feast was celebrated in honor of Saint Joseph as Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Patron of the Universal Church, the latter title having been given to him by Pope Pius IX. Originally celebrated on the third Sunday after Easter with an octave, it was moved to the preceding Wednesday because Wednesday was the day of the week specifically dedicated to St. Joseph. Pope Pius XII later moved this feast to May 1 in 1955. The commission *Ecclesia Dei* has given permission to use the more ancient propers, *Audiutor et Protector noster* (found in the votive Mass of St. Joseph), on this day. We will honor this feast with a High Mass at 6:30pm on Wednesday, May 1.

MAY 5: POTLUCK AND PROGRAM—After the 11am Mass on May 5, there will be a parish potluck and program at the Harrisburg Civic Club, featuring the Choristers from the Friday Religious Education Program, as well as the Drama Class performing the play "Something White: St. Bernadette and Our Lady of Lourdes." MAY 12: MAY CROWNING—On May 12, Mother's Day, we will have our parish May crowning at the 11am High Mass. All students in the parish, K – 12, are invited to participate. All of our parish children are strongly encouraged to join in the procession, regardless of whether you currently participate in CCD or the Friday program. We want to honor our Immaculate Heavenly Mother with a glorious ceremony.

MAY 12: MOTHER'S DAY NOVENA—Mother's Day novena cards are available at the entrance of the church. Please submit your cards no later than May 11. You may place your cards in the collection baskets, or drop them off in the wall slots by the sacristy office or on the first floor of the 112 State Street parish center. 

Notes on Today's Music

Processional hymn: Christ the Lord is Ris'n Again, Recessional hymn: Love's Redeeming Work Is Done, 850

Marian Antiphon: Regina $C\alpha li$, Antonio Lotti (1667–1740) Communion Motet: O quam metuendus est, Tomás Luis de

Victoria

Antonio Lotti's *Regina Cœli* was first published nearly 100 years after its creation by German Catholic Priest, Fr. Karl Proske in 1859. The composition is perhaps the most well known choral setting of the Marian Antiphon. Lotti sets the four voices together rhythmically which allows for the text to be heard clearly, and the bright major key highlights the joyful tenor of the prayer.

The motet *O quam metuendus est* by **Tomás Luis de Victoria** is a setting of the Magnificat antiphon for the dedication of a church. The text is taken from the description of Jacob's Ladder in Genesis: "How awe-inspiring is this place! Surely this can be nothing else but the house of God and the gate of heaven."

Tomás Luis de Victoria (c.1548–1611), along with Palestrina and de Lassus, is one of the greatest composers of the 16th C., famous for its ethereal polyphony. Ordained a priest at age 27, he lived in Rome for years, and assisted St. Philip Neri as chaplain of San Girolamo della Carità.
