SECOND COLLECTION—This week our second collection is for the Building Fund.

FROM YOUR PASTOR: CAMPAIGN STUDY—As you may know, the Priestly Fraternity of St. Peter (FSSP) purchased the Parish Center (112 State Street) in 2022 and offered our parish five years free use of the building while we make determine the benefit the building would have to our parish and the means of the parish to purchase it.

In light of the June 30, 2027, deadline to decide to complete the purchase of the building, now is the time to seek critical feedback from each parishioner. At my request, the parish's finance council and planning committee have developed a plan to ensure that all our buildings continue to serve the mission entrusted to us.

We are studying the possibility of a capital campaign in order to buy the Parish Center by June 30, 2027. At the same time, we are considering several other projects as part of the possible campaign as well:

- Restore the church's rose window, and maintain and improve the schoolhouse.
- Expand the living space for our priests and visitors.
- Eliminate our parish debt, allowing us to direct more funding to mission and ministry.
- Start a classical elementary school.

We want to hear from you before we make any decisions. Starting tomorrow, we will begin a comprehensive survey of our entire parish community. We want to know which projects you believe are the most important for the future of St. Lawrence. The survey, which is part of a process called a planning study, also will gauge support the possible capital fundraising campaign.

By now, you should have received a letter from me with more details about the study, the projects, and about the possibility of a major fundraising effort to pay for some of the projects. Each parish family will be asked to share their input. Your participation in the survey is essential for the success of this planning process. If you did not receive my letter, please let the office know and we will send you the information.—Fr. James M. Smith, FSSP

Notes on Today's Music

Processional hymn: *Jesus, Meek And Lowly*, 833 Recessional hymn: *Come Down, O Love Divine*, 887

Kyriale: Mass XI, 740; Credo IV, 780

Offertory Antiphon: *Domine in Auxilium*, G.P. Palestrina Communion Hymn: *Stabat Mater*, Chant Sequence

This Sunday's Offertory is taken from **G.P. Palestrina's** *Offertoria totius anni*, which contains 68 five-voice choral settings of Offertory Antiphons for Sundays and major feasts. In this motet, he uses a minor key mixed with a raised third to create a complex combination of minor and major feelings in the same work. Palestrina restates the same music as at the beginning because the text repeats itself: *Deign, O Lord, to rescue me; let all be put to shame and confusion who seek to snatch away my life. Deign, O Lord, to rescue me.* –Psalm 39:14-15

G.P. Palestrina (c. 1525–1594) is highly regarded for his contributions of Sacred Polyphony and development of counterpoint in the late 16th Century. In the post-Tridentine period he earned the reputation of the ideal Catholic composer for his success in reconciling the functional and aesthetic aims of Catholic church music. Palestrina wrote over 105 Masses and 250 sacred motets in addition to many other works.
