SECOND COLLECTION—There will be a second collection this week for Eastern Europe.

TODAY: ADULT CATECHISM—There will be no Adult Catechism today as Fr. Smith is to celebrate the High Mass at St. Joseph's in Lancaster this afternoon and will have to leave before class. Classes will resume next Sunday, Jan. 18.

TODAY: NO COFFEE AND DONUT SOCIAL—Coffee and Donut Socials will resume next Sunday, Jan. 18.

TODAY: CCD RESUMES—The Friday education program resumed Friday, Jan. 9., and CCD resumes today, Sunday, Jan. 11.

TODAY: CONSECRATION PREPARATION—The superior general of the FSSP, Fr. John Berg, has asked all of the priests, deacons, seminarians, and the Faithful to whom they minister, to make a 30-day preparation for the renewal of the Consecration of the FSSP to Our Lady Immaculate of Lourdes. The preparation will begin today, Sunday, Jan. 11, and end Monday, Feb. 9, with the public consecration occurring on the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, Wednesday, Feb. 11. Preparation consists of the daily recitation of a decade of the Rosary and the *Memorare*.

EPIPHANY BLESSINGS UNDERWAY—About half of those who signed up to receive Epiphany blessings should have received the blessing by now, and the remaining 50 to 60 blessings are scheduled for Monday and Tuesday of this week. If you signed up and have not been contacted, please reach out to the office at contact@stlawrence.cc.

To see a map of the 12 routes that the priests are taking, visit bit.ly/epiphanytour2026. The 107 homes to be visited is nearly 20 percent more than the 90 homes visited last year. (To see last year's map, visit bit.ly/epiphanytour2025). We are very grateful for the nearly dozen men who volunteered to help the priests visit all of these homes.

When visiting the homes, the priest blesses each room (or at least, whichever rooms you would like him to bless) with Epiphany water and incense, and marks the front door (and other doors if requested) with chalk. Marking the front entrance of the home with the initials of the three Magi, Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar, and a code of the current year (2026) connected with crosses: 20+C+M+B+26 recalls the visit of the Magi. The letters have two meanings: first, they represent the initials of the Magi; and second, they abbreviate the Latin phrase, *Christus mansionem benedicat*, meaning, may Christ bless the house.

NOVERITIS ANNOUNCEMENT—Each year at the Feast of the Epiphany, Mother Church publishes the dates of the most important upcoming feasts of the year, including the date of Easter. This can be done in the form of a chant known as the *Noveritis*, but we include the text and a summary below for your information: "Know, dearest brethren, by the gift of God's mercy, as we have rejoiced for the birth of Our Lord, Jesus Christ, so also we announce to you joy for the Resurrection of the same Our Savior. On the first day of February will be Septuagesima Sunday. On the eighteenth of the same month, the day of Ashes, and the beginning of the fast of most holy Lent. On the fifth of April, we will celebrate with joy the holy Easter of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. On the fourteenth of May will be the Ascension of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. On the twenty-fourth of the same month, the feast of Pentecost. On the fourth of June, the feast of the most holy Body of Christ. On the twenty-ninth of November, the first Sunday of the Advent of Our Lord, Jesus Christ, to whom belong honor and glory forever and ever. Amen."

 Offertory motet: *O Admirabile Commmercium*, Fabio Constantini
 Communion motet: *Alma Redemptoris Mater*, a5, Tomás Luis de Victoria (c.1548–1611)

O Admirabile Commmercium, is a motet by **Fabio Constantini** and setting of the first Antiphon from Vespers on the Octave of Christmas. The translation is: *O admirable exchange: the creator of human-kind, taking on a living body was worthy to be born of a virgin, and, coming forth as a human without seed, has given us his deity in abundance.*

Fabio Constantini (c. 1575–1644) was an Italian music editor and composer. He sang under Palestrina at St Peter's, Rome (until 1610), and held posts as *maestro di cappella*, notably at Orvieto Cathedral (1610-14, 1618-22), Santa Casa, Loreto, Ancona and Ferrara Cathedral.
