ANNOUNCEMENTS

TODAY: NO CCD, OR SOCIALS—There will be no CCD today due to the inclement weather. Coffee and Dount Socials will resume Sunday, Feb. 1.

FR. CORTES VACATION—Father Cortes will be away on vacation starting Monday, Jan. 19, and is scheduled to return Jan. 31.

SNOW STORM—In a letter from Bishop Senior: “While the faithful are obliged to attend Holy Mass on Sundays and Holydays, the obligation presumes a person’s ability to reasonably fulfill it. If a snow emergency is declared by state or local authorities, and/or road conditions are unsafe for travel the obligation to attend Mass is clearly not in force.” The faithful are encouraged to keep Sunday as a day of prayer and quiet.

DIOCESAN ANNUAL CAMPAIGN—Thank you for your part in contributing a total of \$16,485.20 towards this years Diocesan Annual Campaign. However, we are still in need of \$4,934.58 by the end of this month to reach our goal. Please consider making a contribution to help us achieve this goal. The Diocesan Office for Stewardship and Development will be e-mailing 2025 tax statements to any donor with an email address on file with the Diocese later in January. This statement will only reflect gifts given to the Diocese such as the Diocesan Annual Campaign or in response to a direct mail letter. A tax statement for Sunday Offering gifts or gifts to second collections given to the parish will also be sent at the end of January.

PREPARATION FOR CONSECRATION—The superior general of the FSSP, Fr. John Berg, has asked all of the priests, deacons, seminarians, and the Faithful to whom they minister, to make a 30-day preparation for the renewal of the Consecration of the FSSP to Our Lady Immaculate of Lourdes. The preparation began on, Sunday, Jan. 11, and ends Monday, Feb. 9, with the public consecration occurring on the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, Wednesday, Feb. 11. Preparation consists of the daily recitation of a decade of the Rosary and the *Memorare*. This will be said immediately after each Mass.

MASS INTENTIONS OPEN FOR 2026—Parishoners are welcome to submit requests for Mass intentions for the coming year. Once we’ve received several months’ worth of intentions, we will again suspend accepting intentions. Mass intentions should be requested by using the envelopes that can be found on the shelf of the bulletin stand in the Narthex. Each family is limited to four intentions per month.

STAY HOME WHEN SICK—Please note that it is an act of charity not to assist at Mass when you have a communicable illness. Indeed, *Baltimore Catechism III* (Seton Press) instructs us that the Sunday obligation is dispensed for “those who must care for the sick...[and] those whose illness does not permit them to go outdoors,” which includes those who might make others ill.

FEB. 1: LAUNCH OF CAPITAL CAMPAIGN—Next Sunday will mark the launch of the parish capital campaign, Generation to Generations, which is undertaken to secure the future of our parish and preserve the access to Traditional Latin Mass and all of the sacraments in the traditional form here in Harrisburg. This initiative is not simply about buildings or repairs, but about stewardship and fulfilling the mission of the parish. What has been entrusted to us must be strengthened and passed on to those who will come after us. All parishioners are invited to join us in the social hall after each Mass to celebrate our campaign kickoff. Campaign leadership will discuss the campaign and be available to answer your questions.

FEB 1: PALMS FOR ASH WEDNESDAY— Traditionally, the ashes for Ash Wednesday are burned from the palms used during the prior year’s Palm Sunday. Starting on Septuagesima Sunday, Feb. 1 we will begin collecting last year’s palms to be burned for Ash Wednesday. Please place your palms in the basket near the entrance of the church.

FEB. 2: CANDLEMAS—All are encouraged to bring their own beeswax candles to be blessed at the High Mass at 6:30pm on Feb. 2, the Feast of the Purification of Blessed Virgin Mary. The blessing of the candles will occur prior to the 6:30pm Mass. Please place your candles on the floor in front of the door that goes to the courtyard on the Epistle side of the church.

FEB. 3: BLESSING OF THROATS—On the Feast of St. Blaise, come to the church to receive the traditional blessing of throats through the intercession of St. Blaise to be healed of any mid-winter throat ailments. The priests will give the blessing after Mass.

BLESSING OF BREAD, FRUIT, WINE, & WATER—In addition to receiving the blessing yourself on Feb. 3, The Feast of St. Blaise, you may bring bread, fruits, wine, and water to be blessed so that, as the blessing says, “May they who taste thereof be fully healed of all affliction of the throat, as well as every infirmity of soul or body, through the prayers and merits of the same Blaise, Pontiff and Martyr.” The blessing on the Feast of St. Blaise, though, asks the people to bring items to be blessed. It says: “We humbly beseech thy boundless mercy, and beg that these fruits, bread, wine, and water, which thy devoted people bring today, be blessed and sanctified by thy goodness.” You are most welcome (encouraged!) to bring things on that day for the blessing. Bring them before Mass and set them in front of Our Lady’s altar to be blessed immediately after Mass. Note: please do not bring items for this blessing before Feb.3.

BLESSING DROP-OFF LOCATION—If you are in need of a blessing for a rosary or another small icon, you can drop those items off in the Sacristy for the priests to bless. Enter through the door to the left of the Blessed Virgin Mary altar. Leave your item on the bottom shelf of the bookcase for a blessing.

Notes on Today's Music

This Sunday's propers are one of two sets that repeat each Sunday until the liturgical season changes. Both the Offertory and Communion antiphons will be sung as choral settings. The original chant for *Dextera Domini* is in mode 2 and **Orlandus Lassus** uses the original mode for his composition while composing entirely original music for the antiphon. The setting of *Mirabuntur Omnes* is a composition created by a member of the choir.

Orlandus Lassus (c.1532–1594) is known for the mature polyphonic style in the Franco-Flemish school. He wrote over 2,000 works in Latin, French, Italian, and German both sacred and secular. Lassus along with Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina and Tomás Luis de Victoria are the most influential composers of the late Renaissance.
